Introduction


Wikipedia defines: street art as visual art created in public locations, usually unsanctioned artwork executed outside of the context of traditional art venues. Street artists sometimes present socially relevant content infused with an esthetic value, to attract attention to a cause or as a form of "art provocation; stencil graffiti, wheat-pasted poster art or sticker art, street art, sculpture, spray-painted (excluding: territorial graffiti and pure vandalism) and video projection etc···

Many times, a street artist goes by a pseudonym. I include the artist pseudonym or actual name (if it is known) in the title. I also use the word redux to acknowledge this is a reinterpretation of the piece.
